Life Story of my [Alice Sharp] Paternal Grandfather, DANIEL GOODWIN

(Cont'd, from Vol. 3, #1)

Eldridge Almon GOODWIN was their sixth child, born 20 Dec. 1871 and died 25 Jan. 1954 at age 72. He was Road Commissioner in Eliot for many years. I remember he had a Model T Ford with the gas control on the steering wheel. His nickname as a boy was 'Stubby". He married 28 July 1893, Caroline Lulu PERKINS, who had a child, Edith, and then they had 5 children, Carrie, Leon, Earle, Rachel and Roland Arthur. Roland is still living [January, 1981] at his father's former home at corner of Cedar Rd. and Rt. 103 in Eliot. The seventh child was Hattie Eliza, born 29 Jan. 1873 and died 19 Jan. 1954 at age 81. She was severely crippled with arthritis in her later years. Her husband was Job MEADS, who was born in England. They were married. 27 June 1894. They had two children, Beatrice and Frank. Beatrice was handicapped with polio but was able to work in the office of the electric power company in Portsmouth. Lilla Belle was the eighth child, born 15 Nov. 1874, and died 11 July 1964. She married Aaron Burr COLE (date unknown) who was a judge at one time. They had seven children, Myra Ellen, Mildred Frances, Hollis Burr, Hosmer Lawrence, Marion Goodwin, Hobart Atherton, Hoitt Sumner, and Lena Gertrude. Hollis became a lawyer and Lana served in the State Legislature. The ninth to be born was Fred Ernest, born 11 Oct. 1876 and died at age 83, 15 May 1959. Married Ethel STACY, 29 June 1901 and they had 6 children, Ernest, Marjorie, Elizabeth, Frederick, Kenneth and Richard. He lived on Cedar Rd, Eliot near the railroad track where Rt. 236 now is. This home burned. The tenth of their children was Daniel Albert, born 21 Mar. 1878 and died 23 Dec. 1943 at age 65. He was run over by a car on the Portsmouth Navy Yard. He md. Mary Alice MARTIN, 1 June 1904; they lived in the home of his father which they inherited. They had four children, Alexander, Daniel Albert, Jr., Margaret Alice and Mildred. Margaret lived in the family home with her husband and 7 children until she contracted multiple sclerosis and had to sell It. The house is now owned by a family named MORIARTY. They are in process of restoring the house to original condition; beams have been uncovered and old fireplaces opened. Grace was the llth child, born 7 May 1880 and died 1 Oct. 1881. Her untimely death must have caused the family great sadness. Manie was their 12th to be born, 20 Feb. 1882, and died 18 Feb. 1961. She married John EMERY on the 24th of June 1903. They lived across from her oldest sister, Hannah Gertrude (Gertie) on Goodwin Rd. not far from Ambush Rock, in a house which John had moved there. When first married they lived in the house across from the GOODWIN homestead and their first child was born there. They had 6 children, John Maynard, Rina, Ella Gertrude, Ruth, Ernest and Sherman. Daniel GOODWIN died of a heart attack, 26 Jan. 1916, in the shed In back of the house and was discovered by his grandson, Daniel Albert, Jr. who was seven at the time. His wife died 22 April 1923. They are burled in Mt. Pleasant Cemetery, Eliot, Me. He was 83 at his death and she was 80. The birth dates of all Daniel's children and several marriage records were written in the family Bible the genealogical pages of which are in my [Alice sharp] possession.

Not having the privilege of knowing my grandfather because he died before I was born, it has been necessary to depend on genealogical facts gathered in my family research and from memories shared with me by relatives who knew him.

My 2nd cousin one generation removed, Ralph GOODWIN, son of Millard and wife Frances L. BRIGGS wrote to me telling what he remembered of my grandfather. The following is quoted directly from his letter: "I recall two things vividly about your grandfather. One day my father and I were cutting firewood with a circular power saw. I was taking the wood away from the saw when (Gramp) came along to talk to me and he was absent mindedly going to rest his hand on the revolving saw. I knocked his hand away but he still got a very bad cut. He looked at me in amazement as he did not realize what he had done. Your Uncle Bert took him in the house and took care of it. I also remember that he was lying dead in his home on the night of the Marshal House fire in York Harbor and we could see the reflection of it in the sky."

I wish that I had known my grandfather. He and his wife were certainly a most fruitful bough on the family tree. They had 41 grandchildren and an unknown number of great-grandchildren. He must have been proud of his family. He was an honest, hard working man and provided well for them.

GENEALOGY OF FRANCIS LEBARON GOODWIN

Information for the Goodwins obtained from Davis' <u>Ancient Landmarks of</u> *Plymouth*, page 119 of Part II; Genealogies.

Information regarding the LeBaron Genealogy is from a book called <u>Descendants</u> of <u>Francis LeBaron of Plymouth</u>, published at 73 Federal Street, Boston, in 1904, by T.R. Marvin and Son, Printers. The book was written by Mary LeBaron Stockwell, and is a excellent genealogy of the LeBaron family. In it are all these Goodwins who were related to them. The line follows:

- 1. Christopher GOODWIN of Charlestown, Massachusetts. He was probably born in England about 1620 as his eldest son was born in 1643 in this country.
- 2. John GOODWIN, born in 1644; married 1689
- 3. John GOODWIN, born in 1677; no data about family.
- 4. Nathaniel GOODWIN, born 14 May, 1724 in Boston; died 21 May, 1771; married 25 December, 1746 Lydia LeBaron, born 3 December, 1724, d. 24 March, 1801, daughter of Lazarus LeBaron of Plymouth, at Plymouth.

They had eleven children; their ninth child was Francis LeBaron GOODWIN, the surgeon, born 29 September, 1762; married in his 25th year at Plymouth, Massachusetts Jane Prince [ROBBINS?], daughter of Rev. Chandler Robbins, minister at Plymouth. He died at Frankfort, Me. February 20, 1816. I could not find the ten sisters and brothers of Francis LeBaron Goodwin, except one brother named Nathaniel who married Molly, daughter of Thomas Jackson. There was also a John GOODWIN, son of the first Nathaniel, who in 1774 married Hannah, daughter of Thomas Jackson.
